We challenge every church to give prayerfully and sacrificially in the February Alabaster Offering.



JESUS Film Ministry Teams have reported 32,000,081 viewers of the JESUS Film through January 25, 2005. Of these viewers, 4,661,845 (14.6% of viewers) have indicated decisions for Christ and 1,767,861



(37.9% of decisions) are initial discipleship contacts. There have been 5,422 new churches started and 10,944 new pastors are in training. Please pray for these new starts and the pastors in training! 152 JESUS Film language translations used. 98 countries where the JESUS Film is used.

BOOKS FOR PASTORS / TOOLS FOR MINISTRY



I have been meeting with our country and field leadership to put together the proposal for how we will make the project happen here

for our pastors. It will require us to import hundreds of books, to translate, adapt and print hundreds of others. One of the trickiest steps will be distribution, how to get them to the most remote parts, but we WILL get them there! If Jesus tarries, and if everyone gives to this noble project, the improved preaching of the Word from every wooden or clay or bamboo pulpit will reap benefits forever and ever. We are soooo-o-o excited about it.



NAMING THE BOAT IN THE PHILIPPINES

Three years ago our Children's Project was to buy a boat for the Philippines. At that time we thought it was not going to happen but it did! The children raised \$3000, for the project. The following letter was received from David Phillips...

Dear Robert Douglas,

I want to start with an apology. Perhaps tive to purchase and own the boat. The this has been one of the most confusing projects that we have undertaken and I have been incredibly slow about reporting any kind of progress to you. I am very sorry for that and I hope that this

letter will make up partially for the neglect.

When we first received this letter we had a vibrant discussion on how to use it. 3000 dollars was not enough to purchase a boat and even if we could there were potential liability issues to take into account. Who would

own the boat? Who would manage it and so on. For several months we kicked this around. Do we hang on to the funds hoping for additional contributions? Do we join a business or some private fisherman and let them own the boat? How do we work these details?

After many months of discussions between the Region and the Field and

between the Field and the Panay District we decided to form a coopera-Pastors in the Panay District formed a business association. This association then purchased a fishing boat with the purpose of self support and evangelism. In other words, the costs

> of operating the boat would be met by fishing while the boat would be able to reach many of the villages strung along the coastline that cannot be reached through land based vehicles. This boat is now in operation. I will be going to Panay soon and try to get some of the stories from the men

who are operating this ministry.

The boat was named "Fishers of Men Express". The name was submitted by Jessica Howard, Newport, VT.

Pastors Help Assess NMI Programs and Products—A dozen pastors from the U.S.A. and Canada gathered in Kansas City in October. Dr. Nina Gunter, general NMI director, invited the participants to assess the effectiveness of Nazarene Missions International (NMI) in resourcing Nazarene churches as well as brainstorm ideas for the future.

Hurricane Update—In August, several hurricanes pounded the eastern coast of the United States and the Caribbean Region. Although Caribbean Nazarenes suffered loss of lives and property, they held fast to their faith, thanking God for blessing them. The Caribbean Regional Communications Office produced a video to tell the stories of a few hurricane survivors. To view the video, visit www.caribbeannazarene.org.

Nazarenes Respond to CCK Shortage— In August, Nazarene Compassionate Ministries, Inc. (NCMI), sent thousands of Crisis Care Kits (CCKs) to assist hurricane victims, depleting their supply of CCKs. The General NMI Office sent an E-mail to district NMI presidents, asking Nazarenes to respond to the immediate need for

Number 60

CCKs. As of October 28, NCMI, received 13,620 CCKs, which is enough to fill two 40-foot containers!

NMI 90th Anniversary Project—Pastor Jason Matters at New Vision Church of the Nazarene in Raymore, Missouri, came up with a creative idea for raising the NMI 90th Anniversary Offering. "I volunteered to take all the books in my personal library (almost 500), lock them in a jail;" said Pastor Matters. "I will redeen them as we raise the money towards our offering goal. So, until we raise enough money I will be working in the school libraries or with just a few books."

New Church Dedicated in Bulgaria—Nine years ago, the Montana, Bulgaria, congregation worshipped on the side of a mountain to avoid persecution. The Lord gave them a vision to reach all of northwest Bulgaria, and at the center of that vision was a church building. How could they have imagined that God meant the house of a former Communist mayor to be the fulfillment of that vision? With heart-

World Mission Broadcast—A new World Mission Broadcast program, Foshat Amal (Journey of Hope), began broadcasting in the Middle East on November 1. Please pray that the program will give hope to listeners in this war-torn, volatile area of the world

WORLD SCENE

South Korea—Missionaries from South Korea have begun targeting Muslim lands. The British Broadcasting Corporation reports that South Korea has 12,000 missionaries worldwide, and each year 1,000 new ones join them.

Brazil—The World Health Organization (WHO) has declared a suicide epidemic in Brazil. According to the WHO, more than 300 of 30,000 Guarani Kaiova Indians in Mato Grosso do Sul, Brazil, have killed themselves since 1985; 54 succeeded in 2003.

Persecuted Church (IDOP)—Churches from more than 130 countries observed IDOP on November 14, 2004. The World Evangelical Alliance and the National

Evangelical Alliance and the National Association of Evangelicals partnered to join churches worldwide in prayer for those suffering for their faith. Nigeria—Church Around the World reports violent raids on Christian villages in the central state of Nigeria left more than 20 Christians dead and prompted Nigeria's president to declare a state of emergency. Since 2001, more than 2,000 people have

been killed, and thousands of people have fled the area due to the escalation of religious violence. JESUS Film in Siberia—In October, thousands of citizens of Tomsk, Siberia, united for one event—to watch the JESUS film in their own language. Several weeks prior to the 10-day film-showing campaign, the citizens had seen commercials on TV, observed banners and posters in the streets, and received personal invitations to watch the film that had everyone talking. At the cinema in the center of town, a big banner announced "Historical Film JESUS...Admission Free."

The JESUS Film Project, Campus Crusade for Christ Peru—The World Food Program (WFP) says many people in the southern region of Peru are getting only half of the food they need each day. October snow storms and severe frost in Perus Andean mountains were the worst recorded in three decades. Many of the households animals died during the severe weather, either killed by a lack of food or the cold. More than half of Peru's population live below the poverty line, and some 6.5 million people—25% of the population—live on an income of less than \$1 per day.
