

JESUS Film Ministry Teams have reported 32,424,405 viewers of the JESUS Film through March 1, 2005. Of these viewers, 4,708,868 (14.5% of viewers) have indicated decisions for Christ and



1,789,723 (38% of decisions) are initial discipleship contacts. There have been 5,608 new churches started and 12,665 new pastors are in training. Please pray for these new starts and the pastors in training! 152 JESUS Film language translations used. 98 countries where the JESUS Film is used.


The 2005 General NMI Convention in Indianapolis will include inspiration and information as well as interaction with some pastors who might be recipients of the books.



FROM THE HEART - Dr. Nina Gunter A Fatally Slow Alert

"In the January 6, <u>2005 USA today</u>, the editorial focused on "In Asia, a Fatally Slow Alert:"

'On the day a tsunami killed 140,000 people, scientists, and government officials scattered across the Pacific and Asia had inklings of an impending disaster in time to save lives. Yet even in this age of instant global communications, the message never reached those in peril...

Most blame has focused on the lack of a tsunami warning system in the Indian Ocean, but the failure was more fundamental. Warnings were not disseminated for hours...some people couldn't get the word out...others were constrained by reticence, fumbling or fear of disrupting protocol\...leaders are calling for a warning system.'

Application: How faithful are we believers to warn people of the end of time – the return of Christ – the coming judgment of God? Can we pray, give, and go even more so that the "message will reach those in peril" in time for them to experience a grace-based relationship with God? I pray so. By all means, save some."
