People Need to Know and Hear the Gospel Message!

herever I hear something so terrible and shocking, (even to my ears) in the news that sends my soul into *deep mourning, I am reminded by the Holy Spirit to focus on my call.* Many times we can drift away and get too involved in the minor concerns or issues of the day. The News brings me back to reality that we have much work to do in the Vineyard! The Holy Spirit continually leads me to Matthew 24:12 which says "Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold."

As I was watching the news the other evening, my ears and heart went into shock, when I heard the story about a father throwing his three month old baby out of the car, onto a Texas highway! I pondered over that news story for several moments and just prayed to our Lord and Savior My thoughts are.... People need to know the Lord and hear the Gospel message! Or when I read in a Boston newspaper, about a young man on his way to work after watching the Super Bowl being innocently gunned down in the streets. He was neither involved in a gang nor sold drugs. He was just on his way to work to provide for his family! My thoughts are People need to know the Lord and hear the Gospel Message!

Or when I hear a story on the radio, about someone complaining to the Attorney General's office that the cross in the church, where he or she was going to vote, is offensive and should be taken down or covered. My thoughts are ... People need to know the Lord and hear the Gospel message! In the case in Boston, the Attorney General quickly replied that the cross did not need to be covered or taken down. I happened to be in Brooklyn, NY on voting day and went into a church that housed voting booths, and the cross was covered. The Lord helped me within my soul by showing me verse thirteen of the same scripture which says, "but he who stands firm to the end will be saved."

My dear Sisters and Brothers, we must focus on the major issues concerning and surrounding our calls. We must focus on the Major and not the minor of our Call & our Mission!" If we are not careful, we will get off track from the main purpose of our call. Sometimes, we get so frustrated by "the many things" that confront us daily, in our ministries that we sometimes *lose our focus, or concentrate on matters that are not as equally important to our call and mission.*

How do we stay focused on the mission and the call? We should ask ourselves several questions that have been formalized wonderfully by Frederick Buechner pertaining to our call and mission. We should ask ourselves:

"(a) is this something that you need to do and (b) that the

world needs to have it done. If you really get a kick out of your work, you're presumably met requirement (a), but if your work is writing cigarette ads, the chances are you've, missed requirement (b). On the other hand, if your work is being a doctor in a leper colony, you have probably met requirement (b), but if you're bored and depressed by it, chances are you have not only bypassed (a) but probably aren't helping your patients much either. Neither the hair shirt nor the soft berth will do. The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

Saints, we have much work to do in His Vineyard! We must tell the Message to the World today and seek to do *the Call* that we have been called to do!

This is *a new* district event for all husbands of pastors (ordained or licensed). This will become an annual event! Please have them save the date ... *more information to come!*


District Finance Class

Where is Your Focus?

Simple Church by Thom S. Rainer and Eric Geiger continues to be a popular book. It tells us to *do less* and *be more effective*. If I could sit down with you to analyze your local situation, we would probably conclude that "the church is trying to do too much." It is not focused.

When I ask you, "How is your local church planning to win and disciple her next ten Christ-followers?" I am asking a question of focus. Multiplied activity is not necessarily helpful. Focusing on a few essentials probably **is** helpful. What are you, as the pastor, focused on? Are you doing anything well - or - are you going a hundred miles an

hour and seemingly doing nothing well? Where should *your* focus be? Where do you believe your key lay leaders should be focusing?

Possibly sitting down to discuss the above questions would be helpful to you. Four pastors have invited me into that process at a deeper level and that's why I am here. Let me know if you are ready for such a conversation.

By Assembly, you are encouraged to place your church's plan to reach her next ten disciples for Jesus on paper --- just on *one page* and give it to Dr. Owens and me. This will be confidential (meaning we won't spread it around without your per-

mission), but we hope you will use it to discuss ideas with one another. Who knows who you may help in the process - maybe even yourself!

May the Lord continue to bless you as you seek to be a **healthy pastor**

leading a healthy church that grows and reproduces.

Hurt: Inside the World of Today's Teenagers

In last month's newsletter I suggested that the book, Hurt: Inside the World of Today's Teenagers by Chap Clark, was well worth the read. Since I was asked to contribute again I thought I would share an insight I

gained and how Chap's research has changed the way I view ministry to teenagers. Please understand it was not only this book but many things over the past several years which continue to have a profound impact on my view of ministry today.

As I mentioned last time, Chap's contention is that our culture, including the church, has for all intents and purposes abandoned our youth. To see this I will begin with the end of the book where he states, "The only way we can stem the tide of the consequences of abandonment is to encour-


age a wide variety of adults to take part in the lives of the young. Nothing else will make a difference--not more base-ball fields, more programs and events, or more job opportunities. Because the root of the issues related to contemporary adolescence has to do with leaving this age group to flounder on its own, the answer is relationships with adults who sincerely care. This is the sole need of this abandoned generation." [italics added]

Prior to reading this book I had the opportunity to hear Chap speak at a conference. One statement he made resonated with me and continues to "haunt me." He said something to the effect, "We used to say that we needed one adult for every 7 to 10 teenagers, but what they need is seven adults for every one teenager." How would our youth ministries change if every student within our influence had seven adults "who sincerely care[d]" about them and knew more than just their name. I've pondered the possibility that one fallacy of the church which has

contributed to our abandonment of our youth is the full-time youth pastor? I know that might be hard to swallow at first glance, but remember I am only suggesting this as a possibility. For many of us youth pastors, we are often only adult in the 1 to 7 or 10 ratio.

What do we do? Fall desperately in love with God or fall deeper in love with God, which ever the case may be. Then allow Him to reveal to us, and other adults in our faith community, the kids He wants us to sincerely care for. We might just find it's not only the

kids in our youth groups He brings across our path but maybe, just maybe, some kids we've never considered.
