2007 - The Mission -- The Vision

Greetings Saints! I trust that all is well with you and your families. I have just recently returned from Kansas City and New York City. In Kansas City a new mission statement was recently released by the General Church. I like it. It will be helpful in guiding us in telling the Story of Jesus Christ. Only seven words. In Matthew 28:19, Jesus gives us the Great Commission by saying, "therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. In Luke 5:9 (NKJV) Jesus says to the Simon Peter, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men." Eleven

Jesus presented a compelling vision, using assuring terms (do not be afraid), familiar pictures (you will catch), and a challenging goal. He cast His Vision in *one sentence of 11 words!* A vision or mission statement should be *short*,

sharp, and shaped to fit the people. OUR new mission statement is short, (only seven words), sharp and shaped ready to fit the generation of people who are constantly and continually on the go and ready to receive information quickly!

To make Christlike disciples in the nations!

If you were to go onto our Nazarene Headquarters website, just above the new mission statement are two words SPREADING HOPE. Each and every one of us is called to spread hope and "To make Christlike disciples in the nations." I saw this vision, this mission statement being carried out in a train car in New York City. If you have ever ridden in a transit train car, you would know that there are many, many crazy things that happen in and on a subway system. I was sitting in a fairly crowded train car and all of a sudden, a man started to say "ladies and

gentlemen, this is the Word of the Lord!" I looked and thought for a moment that perhaps he was crazy, as I am sure everyone in the train thought that he was.

I looked and listened a little closer, no, a lot closer, and realized that this place, this time, was this man's church. He was attempting to make Christlike disciples in the nations. He was reciting scripture from memory and he was doing what God had called him to do: to put forth the message and to make Christlike disciples in the nations! What better place than a subway car? In this particular car, which normally

Becky Turcott Appointed Chair of Ministerial Studies Board

Born into a Nazarene parsonage, Becky had been "in training" for ministry from her earliest days. But it wasn't until she was almost 40 that she recognized God's call to full-time ministry. She was ordained as an Elder in the Church of the Nazarene in 1996. Becky has held various pastoral positions at Community Chapel in

Nashua, New Hampshire since 1990 and is currently serving there as Senior Associate Pastor.

She summarizes her desire as a minister of the gospel and pastor to His people in the words of the Apostle Paul: "As apostles of Christ we could have been a burden to you, 7 but we were gentle among you, like a mother caring for her little children. 8We loved you so much that we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well, because you had become so dear to us. 13 And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which

you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is at work in you who believe." All societies are encouraged to use the curriculum for Mission Education but it is no longer a requirement. The use of the Curriculum will become part of requirement #4 in Mission Education.

Other sources of education include Global Glimpses, World Mission DVD, Mission Connection, New England Missionary Messenger, Mission Books, tapes and CDs to name a few.

NMI Yearly Reports




