Dr. Jesse C. Middendorf, General Superintendent

Dr. Jesse C. Middendorf is a general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene with an office at the International Center of the denomination in Kansas City, Missouri.

He was chosen for the highest elected office in the church at the 25th General Assembly at Indianapolis, Indiana, in June 2001, after serving for ten years as senior pastor of First Church of the Nazarene of Kansas City, Missouri.

Dr. Jesse Middendorf was born in Nashville, Tennessee. He has been preaching since age 16, was first district licensed while a student at Trevecca Nazarene College (now University) on the Tennessee District, and ordained an elder in the Church of the Nazarene in 1969 on that district. He received his bachelor of arts degree from Trevecca Nazarene University in 1965 and his master of divinity degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary in 1968. In 1989 Southern Nazarene University conferred upon him the doctor of divinity degree. He earned a doctor of ministry degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary in 1999.

He has pastored Nazarene churches in Clarksville, Tennessee; Ashland, Kentucky; Albuquerque, New Mexico; Richardson, Texas; and Kansas City, Missouri. During the years 1985-1991 he was superintendent of the Northwest Oklahoma District Church of the Nazarene.

He has written numerous articles for various religious periodicals, has authored chapters in several books, and is author/editor of The Handbook of Christian Ritual published in 1997.

Dr. Middendorf's hobbies include playing golf and flying single-engine aircraft. He and his wife, Susan (nee Marlowe), have three children: Jon, Marlo, and Jim; and four grand-children.


TWO Reports Due: NMI Report and the Pastor's Report

World Mission Broadcast - A Testimony

In 2002 Angela Caicedo was the 24-year old pastor of a Nazarene church in Medellin, Colombia. Her daily radio program, *La Hora Nazarena*, was having a tremendous impact on her community. In the midst of this tremendous response, Pastor Angela was diagnosed with cancer. In 2007 the pastor writes...

"A few months ago Cristina was diagnosed with breast cancer. Her fiancé, Alexis, was very distressed, so much so that the man driving

the taxi noticed his preoccupation. He opened his heart and the young taxi driver told him that on the radio he had listened to the testimony of a woman that God healed from cancer. The testimony was mine. The taxi driver told him about the radio program and put he and Cristina in touch with us. It was a true joy to meet them and to be able to pray with them. Alexis told me before it cost him to believe in God, but through Cristina's situation he realized that God is real. What a joy to know that in a taxi, people can hear of God's love."

Like Cristina and Alexis, listeners are hearing about God's love on World Mission Broadcast (WMB) programs all over the world. 
