We Must Continue to Tell the Story

First, I would like to say thank you for all the kind notes, letters, flowers, fruit basket, and cards that I have received over the past few weeks since my surgery! I know why I "serve in the best district in the whole wide world" is because the folks in this district are the "best folks in the whole wide world!" While I was off of my feet, I happened to catch a day time program (*which is extremely rare for me*) and this woman was sharing with the talk host she did not know how to pray!

As I listened to her share and express her spiritual journey, I thought about some themes that were shared in Dan Kimball book, *They Like Jesus But Not The Church*. The woman from the program was sharing about how she started her spiritual journey and how she discovered communicating with God. I thought about the fact that we as a Nazarene people must continue to tell the greatest Story ever told, which is that Jesus is Lord of lords and King of kings! Furthermore, we must share with others and be more intentional in our delivery of His Message by being more Missional. Listed below are some of Mr. Kimball thoughts regarding Missional that I think are awesome!

- Being Missional means that we see ourselves as representatives of Jesus "sent" into our communities, and that the church aligns everything it does with the mission of God.
- Being Missional means we see the church not as place we go only on Sunday, but as something we are throughout the week.
- Being Missional means that we understand we don't "bring Jesus" to people but that we realize Jesus is active in culture and we join Him in what He is doing.
- Being Missional means we are very much in the world and engaged in culture but are not conforming to the world.
- Being Missional means we serve our communities, and that we build relationships with the people in them, rather than seeing them as evangelistic targets.
- Being Missional means being all the more dependent on Jesus and the Spirit through prayer, the Scriptures, and each other in community.

Continue to share and tell "the Greatest Story that you ever heard!

Keene Church Under Construction

John Reilly began his ministry at the Keene Church of the Nazarene in 1999. After several years of prayer and preparation, the church has undertaken a building project.

Tell us a little about your vision for the Keene church and how a building project fits into that vision.

Our vision is in three parts:

1. To be witnesses of God's hope in our lives. Our building permit was issued at 4:00 p.m. on September 11, previously a day of destruction but God is using us as part of his plan to rebuild hope in America.

- 2. To be a community of unity built on the love of Jesus Christ. Our new addition has a goal of 100% participation, everyone praying, paying tithe, sharing talents, spending time, showing the world our commitment to love one another and to work toward a vision that is bigger than we are; sharing God's love with the world.
- 3. To celebrate the joy of the Holy Spirit at work within us. We have a master plan that has three parts. We are celebrating this first step of faith with joy as we seek to be partners with God in providing greater access to God's word in our community.

Tell us about the process of getting to this point in the building of an addition.

Over the past eight years the Keene church has been growing spiritually and numerically. In 2005, the Keene church had its best a.m. average in its history. Excitement of growth motivated us to look into the expansion of our facility. When first draft plans came back from the architect we knew it was more than we could handle financially. The phased plan approach was adopted. The new addition will provide an elevator for handicapped people, more bathroom facilities, bigger fover for fellowship and more Sunday school space.

Frustrations included the huge bureaucracy and the many agencies we needed to consult for approval. Sometimes we were in a catch 22 where one approval was required and depended on another. The process of dreaming is time consuming. Everyone has their wish list for the new addition. An answer to prayer is the wonderful affirmation of a positive vote by the

congregation to move forward with the prepared plans. On August 5, we celebrated the eight year anniversary of Pastor and People with Com-



munion, breaking bread inside, and then we all went outside for an intergenerational ground breaking celebration.

The church is the living body of Christ and it is wonderful to be part of the dynamic interaction that evolves into a unity of effort to accomplish God's plan. Our theme for the building program has been, "God's Plan - Our Purpose." We as a body of Christ are committed to knowing His plan for us and so our purpose is to work with him to accomplish his plan. These are exciting days for Keene as we depend on the Holy Spirit. In Him we find the refreshment of God's love and grace.

World Evangelism Fund and the Thanksgiving Offering



Experience tells me that Board Meeting Agendas are rapidly consumed with the business of the church. With the little time that we actually get to accomplish that business, the agenda of prayer is often squeezed out. No surprise there.

We can choose to either let modern rhythms downsize prayer into func-

tional insignificance, or we can look for ways to subtly alter the rhythm.

A Friday night – Saturday morning board retreat may be just the shift you need. Enter by 8:00 p.m. and spend time discussing your vision for the church. Wake to breakfast, then head to prayer. Reflect on your prayer time, eat lunch, and head for home.

Bring your own sleeping bags and we can put you in a home on the campground for as little as \$45/person – and that includes two meals and a snack Friday night! This special rate is for Nazarene church board or leadership groups only – and is linked to the homes on the campground.

Now is the time to think ahead to March/April/May, just after you have elected you new board. If the retreat date is on the nominations letter you send to candidates, you'll have less trouble with scheduling conflicts. And who knows what God will do in your hearts as you

seek His face!

By the Way ... There is lots of space for Teen Retreats in winter. Consider scheduling an inexpensive teen retreat here during your teens' Winter Break from school. You can even schedule a skiing trip to a nearby slope. Call us if you need help with the planning or with finding speakers.

Please also don't forget that your people can actually go door to door and invite.


Consider Rendezvous
